17th Street Working Group Additional Suggested Improvement Items

The following items were added by working group members in addition to the 10 included in the initial ranking survey.

- Construct a northern parallel street to 17th Street via 15th Street, Cordova 15 to US1
- Construct a traffic barrier on the 17th Street bridge between traffic and people on bikes
- Construct a remote parking lot with shuttle to convention center and areas north and south of 17th Street
- Addition of utility box wraps as wayfinding throughout the corridor
- Create a raised "pedestrian mall" connection between the County Convention Center and the north side of 17th Street
- Reduce the volume of traffic on US1/Federal Highway via other connections to I595
- Active police enforcement of vehicular, cyclist, and pedestrian behavior
- Active traffic management by FDOT
- Repurposing of Evergreen Cemetery
- Completion of an Origin and Destination (O&D) Study
- Availability of transit and/or shuttles between 17th Street and Downtown offices

Of the options above, 4 total working group members suggested the establishment of a park and ride facility and 2 members suggested active traffic management by FDOT. A total of 7 working group members provided additional comments on their surveys.
