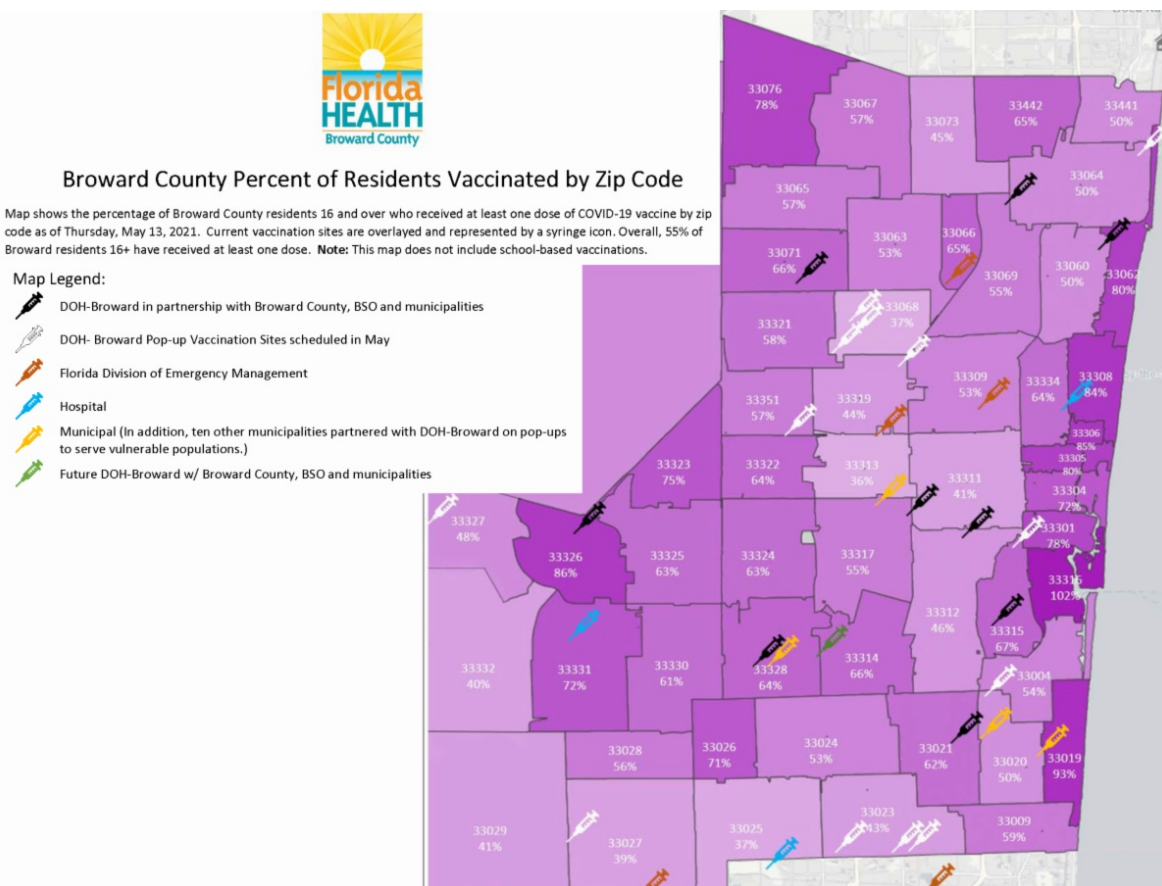




Dear Neighbor,

## Concerts, Artwalk, and Events to Offer COVID Vaccines

The City of Fort Lauderdale is launching Take Your Shot - a community campaign to offer COVID-19 vaccines as major events return.

“This is a great opportunity for people that have been unable or hesitant to get a vaccine to now get one,” Mayor Dean Trantalis said. “By delivering the vaccines to places where groups of people are will allow us to put the pandemic behind us, sooner rather than later.”

The program will kick off Friday, May 14 with a pop-up vaccine site at the Shane Duncan Band concert at Huizenga Plaza (32 E. Las Olas Blvd., Ft. Lauderdale) presented by the City of Fort Lauderdale and Riverwalk Fort Lauderdale. The Florida Department of Health in Broward County will administer first dose Pfizer vaccines from 6-8 p.m. Funky Buddha Brewery will be handing out coupons for anyone getting a shot. Vaccines are available for children ages 12 and over and adults. Minors must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian with documentation (birth certificate, guardianship

papers, etc.).

On May 29, a vaccine pop-up site (for ages 12 and up) will be offered at the MASS District (Music & Arts South of Sunrise) *FTL*Artwalk starting at 6 p.m. <https://tockify.com/massdistrict/detail/4/1622325600000>

Walmart will be giving vaccines at Carter Park Jamz (1450 W. Sunrise Blvd., Fort Lauderdale) on June 18. The event starts at 7 p.m.

Additional community vaccination events will be announced as they are scheduled.

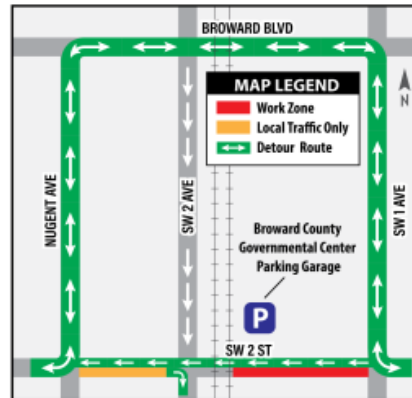

# PUMP STATION A-7 UPGRADE PROJECT

## Infrastructure Improvements Coming to Your Community

The City of Fort Lauderdale is upgrading Pump Station A-7 located on the south side of SW 2 Street between SW 1 Avenue and SW 2 Avenue. The project includes mechanical and electrical improvements at the pump station and asphalt, curb, and paver restoration in the surrounding area. Once completed, these upgrades are expected to significantly increase the capacity of the wastewater system in the Downtown area. Work is scheduled to begin Monday, May 24 and be completed in fall 2021. Construction activities are expected to take place Monday through Friday between 7 a.m. and 5 p.m. This schedule is subject to change based on inclement weather or other unforeseen circumstances.



### Road Closures

Both eastbound lanes of SW 2 Street will be closed to through traffic from Nugent Avenue to SW 1 Avenue for the duration of construction. Traffic will be detoured to Nugent Avenue, Broward Boulevard, and SW 1 Avenue. Access will be provided to local traffic only from Nugent Avenue to SW 2 Avenue. The Broward County Governmental Center Garage will only be accessible from westbound SW 2 Street. All traffic exiting the garage must turn right and head west toward Nugent Avenue. Please follow posted signs and drive with caution in the area.

We apologize for any inconvenience and thank our neighbors for their continued patience as we work to upgrade our sewer system as quickly as possible.

## Hurricane Season Starts June 1; Red Cross Urges People to Get Ready Now National Hurricane Preparedness Week Perfect Time to Prepare

Broward, Fla. (May 11, 2021) — National Hurricane Preparedness Week runs from May 9 through May 15, and the American Red Cross urges everyone to plan now for any possible dangerous storms this year.

"After back-to-back years of active hurricane seasons that have broken records, this year it's more important than ever before to get ready now," said Paula Prendergast, Executive Director for the Broward County Chapter. "Last year, on top of the pandemic, we saw a record 30 named storms with two hitting the southeast before the actual start of hurricane season."

GETTING READY IS EASY There are simple steps you can take to be prepared:

- [Create an evacuation plan](#). Plan what to do in case you are separated from your family during an emergency and if you have to evacuate. Coordinate your plan with your child's school, your work and your community's emergency plans. Plan multiple routes to local shelters, register family members with special medical needs as required and make plans for pets. If you already have an emergency plan, update it and review with family members so everyone knows what to do if an emergency occurs.
  - [Build an emergency kit](#) with a gallon of water per person, per day, non-perishable food, a flashlight, battery-powered radio, first aid kit, medications, supplies for an infant and pets if applicable, a multi-purpose tool, personal hygiene items, copies of important papers, cell phone chargers, extra cash, blankets, maps of the area and emergency contact information. Because of the pandemic, include a mask for everyone in your household.
  - If you already have a disaster kit, now is the time make sure the food and water is still okay to consume and that copies of important documents are up to date.
  - [Be informed](#). Find out how local officials will contact you during a disaster and how you will get important information, such as evacuation orders.
  - Download the free Red Cross Emergency app to help keep you and your loved ones safe with real-time alerts, open Red Cross shelter locations and safety advice on hurricanes and other emergencies.
  - Standard homeowners insurance doesn't cover flooding. ## **OUR FLORIDA**

### **Renter Required Documentation**

- Identification, such as driver's license, birth certificate or passport.
- Current lease agreement or other proof of rental arrangements, such as receipts, bank records or canceled checks that show a pattern of rent payments.
- Documentation of annual income, such as 2020 tax filings, a W-2 or 1099 from your employer, or other proof of income; or documentation of monthly income, such as pay stubs, bank statements, income certification for housing subsidy, or other proof of income.
- Proof of eligibility for benefits from SNAP, TANF, Medicaid, subsidized housing or low-income housing.
- Documentation of unemployment benefits or proof of reduction in household income or proof of increased costs (medical expenses, child care, transportation) due to COVID-19.
- Notice of past due rent, lease termination or eviction, or condemnation order or failed inspection report from local government.

The City uses Alert FTL to send mass notifications and keep citizens informed in the event of an emergency.

Alert FTL is free to neighbors, simply [click here to sign up](#) or call our [24-Hour Customer Service Center](#) at 954-828-8000.

### How Alert FTL works

- Alert FTL is powered by Everbridge
- Alert FTL delivers notifications by phone, email, and/or text.
- Alert FTL is compatible with TDD/TTY devices for those who are deaf or hard of hearing.
- When the City issues an Alert FTL notification, the 24-hour Neighbor Service Center phone number, 954-828-8000, will appear on the caller ID.
- Notifications cannot be delivered to phone numbers with a privacy lock feature. To ensure notifications are received, subscribers should either turn off the privacy lock feature during emergencies, enter 954-828-8000 on their “safe list” of phone numbers, or enter a cell phone number when registering for the service.
- Individuals who have already registered for the service but would like to update their phone number or add a cell phone number to the database may do so by re-registering.
- The Everbridge Mobile app sends geographically-based messages to subscribers nationwide.

The Alert FTL telephone database is generated from the City’s Utility Billing records, Geographic Information Systems (GIS) mapping layers, and manual registrations completed online or through Customer Service.

The Federal Communications Commission prohibits Alert FTL from calling a cell phone except in life safety emergencies. Fort Lauderdale neighbors and business owners who only use cell phones should manually register their cell phone numbers with Alert FTL to ensure they receive notifications.

The American Rescue Plan Act established the Restaurant Revitalization Fund (RRF) to provide funding to help restaurants and other eligible businesses keep their doors open.

This program will provide restaurants with funding equal to their pandemic-related revenue loss up to \$10 million per business and no more than \$5 million per physical location.

Recipients are not required to repay the funding as long as funds are used for eligible uses no later than March 11, 2023.

## EMERGENCY RENT ASSISTANCE

A new Broward County program can pay up to 12 months in past due rent and utilities if renters have experienced financial hardship due to the COVID-19 pandemic.



## COVID-19 EMERGENCY RENTAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM



### ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

A rental household meeting the following:

- At least one individual in the household qualifies for unemployment or has reduced income, significant costs or financial hardship due to COVID-19.
- Risk of homelessness or housing instability.
- Household income at or below 80% of area median income (AMI). Visit this page [for an income breakdown](#).
- Must be a renter/landlord in Broward County.

### APPLICATION PROCESS

Applications may be submitted by either an eligible tenant or by a landlord on behalf of an eligible tenant.

### AVAILABLE ASSISTANCE

Eligible households may receive up to 12 months of rental and utility or energy costs arrears (in addition to or separate from rental assistance), plus an additional three months if needed to ensure housing stability and if program funds are available.

### PAYMENT

Rental assistance funds will be paid directly to the landlord/property management company or utility company on the tenant's behalf.

Broward County Commission has launched an Emergency Rental Assistance program for residents who have been impacted by Covid-19 and meet certain income requirements. This Emergency Rental Assistance Program (ERAP), which provides the County with \$53 million in U.S. Treasury Department funds, is different than previous programs offered, so even if renters were not qualified for, or elected not to participate in, other rental assistance programs, they should take a moment to review this new assistance.

ERAP provides up to 12 months of past due rent and utility payments (back to March 13, 2020) for low-income rental households that have experienced financial hardships as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. Additionally, eligible households can receive up to three months of future payments if needed to ensure housing stability, and if funds are available.

Tenants and landlords must work together to participate in the program, and funds will be paid directly to landlords/rental management companies and utility providers. The county has made various resources available to assist in the application process, including local intake centers where help is offered in person, as well as a call center staffed with multilingual English/Spanish/Haitian Creole professionals from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday-Friday.
