### **GENERAL COMMENTS**

The following comments are for informational purposes.

Please consider the following prior to submittal for Final DRC:

- The Florida Building Code shall apply to the construction, alteration, movement, enlargement, replacement, repair, equipment, use and occupancy, location, maintenance, removal and demolition of every building or structure or any appurtenances connected or attached to such buildings or structures.
- 2. All projects must consider safeguards during the construction process. Florida Building Code Chapter 33 delineates various safeguards that may apply during the construction phase. All structures associated with the protection of pedestrians will require a separate permit. A licensed professional must sign and seal the plans and specifications.
- 3. The City of Fort Lauderdale is a participating municipality in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP). The requirements specific to the City of Fort Lauderdale can be found in

Submit water capacity availability reauest form and documents/ wastewater https://www.fortlauderdale.gov/departments/sustainable-development/buildingservices/engineering-permits-forms-and-information/development-review-committee-servicedemand-calculations-for-water-sewer-request-form
- 2. Show and label existing Right-of-Way, proposed Right-of-Way and/or Easement boundaries as appropriate.
- 3. Any existing driveway opening along NW 19th Street shall be removed and replace with typical roadway section improvements (Sidewalk and Type "Curb and Gutter). Please coordinate said roadway improvements requirements with Broward County.
- 4. Provide storm runoff calculations, signed and sealed by a Florida registered professional engineer.

- 1. Tree preservation requirements apply and should be followed. Please investigate relocation of the trees and palms on site.
- 2. Provide an existing tree site plan or existing tree site survey illustrating all existing trees and palms, and number each one.
- 3. Provide a corresponding list, as per ULDR 47-21.15, of these trees/palms including:
  - a. tree number for each
  - b. botanical name and common name for each
  - c. trunk diameter, in inches, at chest height for trees
  - d. clear trunk in feet for palms
  - e. condition percentage as a number for each
  - f. indicate status for all existing trees/palms on site (remain, relocate, remove)
- 4. Please have a certified ISA Arborist provide the information as to the existing trees including the condition ratings that will be required for mitigation purposes. Please demonstrate how tree and palm equivalent replacement and equivalent value will be provided.
- 5. Section 47-25.3.h. All exterior trash, loading and equipment storage facilities should be screened so as not to be visible from adjoining public corridors and landscaped to moderate views from surrounding buildings. Mechanical equipment including all handling units, exhaust outlets, transformer boxes, electric switching units, etc. should be appropriately screened by planting and/or low walls wherever it cannot be concealed within the building volume. Please provide additional screening to the transformer box to fulfill this requirement.
- 6. Section 47-21.13.B.16. street trees... A minimum of fifty percent (50%) of the required street trees shall be shade trees, and the remaining street trees may be provided as flowering or palm trees. Street trees shall be provided at a ratio of one street tree per forty (40) feet of street frontage, or greater fraction thereof, not subtracting ingress and egress dimensions. Where overhead utilities exist, required street trees may be small trees provided at a ratio of one street tree per twenty (20) feet of street frontage.
  - a. Please provide additional tree, palm materials to fulfill this requirement with no more than 12 feet from the travel lane.
  - b. Due to the adjacent FPL lines, please continue to propose materials compatible to the overhead power lines.
  - c. Canopy encroaching the public realm of the sidewalk, please provide at a minimum 6 feet canopy height clearance when installed.
  - d. Canopy may encroach the sight triangle, providing when installed, a minimum of 8 feet canopy height clearance is provided.
  - e. Canopy trees that encroach the sidewalk and or sight triangle, please provide trees with a minimum 50% canopy to 50% trunk ratio.
- 7. The additional portion of land shown to be purchased appears to have light poles for the outside area of the neighboring property to the west. Please have these removed for additional landscape materials may be proposed to meet site requirements.

- 8. Trees to count toward the VUA are to be within 10 feet of edge of pavement.
  - a. Please propose trees and palms counting for the VUA requirement are no more than 10 feet from the edge of pavement.
  - b. Shade trees at 3.5-inch trunk caliper are to be dispersed evenly between the interior and perimeter landscape.
  - c. Shade trees with 3-inch caliper trunk or larger require a minimum 225 square feet pervious area with 15 feet width being the smallest dimension. This minimum dimension may be reduced by using a product approved for root development under paved areas.
- 9. The use of structural soil is required in paved sites to provide adequate soil volumes for tree roots under pavements, as per ULDR Section 47-21.13. Structural soil details and specifications can be obtained at <a href="http://www.hort.cornell.edu/uhi/outreach/index.htm#soil">http://www.hort.cornell.edu/uhi/outreach/index.htm#soil</a> This is to be provided at a minimum of 8' radii of tree trunks, and is to be consistently illustrated and noted on landscape, site and civil plans.

The structural soil drain is required when percolation rates are less than 4" vertical clearance per hour. Provide documentation of report used to prove this calculation. The drain and connections are to be illustrated on civil plans.

- a. Demonstrate hashing on landscape, site and civil plans as to the extent of use of the Structural Soil.
- b. Provide Structural Soil Detail and composition.

There is a product that the Landscape Department will approve the use of in place of Structural soil. A suspension modular paving system product will provide the required root development area for a healthy and vibrant tree, along with their use it will allow the utilities to be in place and not affect their location in conjunction with the tree's root system. Please look into the use of the Green Blue Urban soil cell, Silva cell or like product for this and all future site developments. As with the use of Structural soil a detail of the product and indication of the extent of use to be provided of the soil cell pavement support systems product.

10. Please investigate and propose landscape cutout areas with ground cover shrubs, trees, and palms within the two 18 x 27 feet deck areas on the south side of the structure. Trees and palms within these areas may be able to count toward VUA requirements. Flowering trees and palms would need a 7.5 feet horizontal clearance from the structure. Large palms 5x5 feet minimum cutout, thin trunked palms 4x4 feet minimum cutout. Small maturing trees the minimum cutout may be 5x5 feet. Medium size trees 64 square feet with 8 feet being the smallest dimension.

Please consider the following prior to submittal for Building Permit:

1. A separate sub-permit application for Tree Removal, Relocation, and General Landscaping for site is required at time of master permit submittal. These are Landscape and Tree permit application documents different than the Broward County standard applications. Please not at this time of DRC submittal. Trees and palms shown to be removed that originate on both this site and a neighboring property. Written permission in a form of a letter from the neighboring property owner, signed, dated, and notarized will be required at time of permitting.

2. Provide separate Plumbing sub permit application for irrigation. Irrigation plans are required at time of Building permit submittal. Plans are to be in compliance with ULDR 47-21.6.A.11 and 47-21.10. Note that planting areas are to be irrigated on a separate zone than the turf areas so that once the plants are established, that particular zone can be shut off based on the season. The overall goal is to decrease water use through irrigation. Plant material must be grouped together based on watering needs (hydrozone) and turf areas must be limited and/or consolidated to less than 50% of the landscaped area. Illustrate hydrozones on planting plan and include calculations in table.

- 1. Garbage, Recycling and Bulk Trash shall be provided.
- 2. Recycling reduces the amount of trash your business creates, and it is the best way to reduce monthly waste disposal costs and improve your company's bottom line.
- 3. Solid Waste Services shall be provided by a Private Contractor licensed by the City.
- 4. Service Days shall be: No restriction for Commercial collection. Service may not occur earlier than 7:00 am or later than 7:00 pm within 250 feet of residential.
- 5. Containers: must comply with 47-19.4
- 6. Dumpster enclosure: concrete pad, decorative block wall, gates hung independently, protective bollards, secondary pedestrian side entry, high strengthen apron and driveway approach, night light, hot water, hose bib, drain, low circulating ventilation for dampness, weep holes, landscaping, smooth surface walkway to accommodate wheeled containers.
- 7. Provide on the site plan a garbage truck turning radii for City review. Indicate how truck will circulate within property.
- 8. Solid Waste Collection shall be on private property container shall not be placed, stored, or block the public street to perform service (large multifamily and commercial parcels).
- 9. Submit a Solid Waste Management Plan on your letterhead containing name of project, address, DRC case number, number of units if applicable, and indicate whether it is Pre or Final DRC.
  - This letter is to be approved and signed off by the Sustainability Division and should be attached to your drawings. Please email an electronic copy to dwilson@fortlauderdale.gov. Letter should include an analysis of the expected amounts of solid waste and recyclables that will be generated (if different from current capacity), and container requirements to meet proposed capacity.
  - o Community Inspections will reference this Solid Waste Plan for sanitation compliance issues at this location.

# **CASE COMMENTS:**

- 1. Submit a traffic impact statement and coordinate with the Transportation and Mobility Department regarding traffic calming and a traffic impact study if needed. A traffic study is needed Pursuant to 47-25.2.M.4. Applicant must fund City's review by consultant and pay a \$4,000 deposit prior to scheduling a methodology meeting after which the study will be prepared, transmitted and reviewed by the City's consultant. Staff and consultant's review concerns shall be adequately resolved prior to gaining authorization for either the Planning & Zoning Board or City Commission hearings. Take into consideration that the review of this study, once submitted, will take about 4-6 weeks once all documents are received.
- 2. A parking study will be required for the parking reduction request as per the site plan. Applicant must fund City's review by consultant and pay a \$4,000 deposit prior to scheduling a methodology meeting after which the study will be prepared, transmitted and reviewed by the City's consultant. Staff and consultant's review concerns shall be adequately resolved prior to gaining authorization for either the Planning & Zoning Board or City Commission hearings. Take into consideration that the review of this study, once submitted, will take about 4-6 weeks once all documents are received.
- 3. Show proposed ADA ramps provide clear minimum requirement ADA width for safe pedestrian passage around both existing poles.
- 4. Show inbound and outbound stacking requirements from the property line to the first conflict point according to Section 47-20.5 General design of parking facilities for the driveway.
- 5. Include a table showing the proposed land uses, the floor area in square feet for each land use, the parking ratio, the number of parking spaces required by type, and the number of parking spaces proposed by type (standard, compact, handicapped, bicycle, loading, etc.). ULDR Sec. 47-20.2. Parking and loading zone requirements.
- 6. All parking must be provided in accordance with design and construction standards of the ULDR Section 47-20.11. Show dimensions for: stall width, depth of stall 90 degrees to aisle, aisle width, width of stall parallel to aisle, module width, angle of parking stalls.
- 7. Illustrate clear sight triangle for the intersections and driveways.
- 8. Ensure all access points, sidewalks, walkways, and curb cuts are unobstructed and ADA accessible with appropriate slopes and detectable warning devices and indicate on the site plan. This includes all access to/from the site entrance. Add the dimension, clearances and slopes of the walkways.
- 9. Bicycle parking is strongly encouraged. Consult the APBP Bicycle Parking Guidelines, city of Fort Lauderdale Parking Standards and Broward County End-of-Trip Bicycle Facilities Guide. Look to provide the minimum long term and short-term bicycle parking based on requirements in the guide and include total counts on the site plan data sheet. Bicycle parking needs to be located on the site so that it is accessible to the public.

- 1) Pursuant to Public Participation requirements of Unified Land Development Regulations (ULDR), Sections 47-24.1.F.14 and 47-27.4.A.2.c, the applicant must complete the following:
  - a. Prior to submittal of an application to the Planning and Zoning Board (PZB), the applicant shall:
    - 1. Provide notice via e-mail and regular mail to the official city-recognized civic organization(s) within 300 feet of the proposed project, notifying of the date, time and place of applicant's project presentation meeting to take place prior to the PZB meeting (a listing of officially-recognized neighborhood associations is provided on the City of Fort Lauderdale website: <a href="http://www.fortlauderdale.gov/neighbors/civic-associations">http://www.fortlauderdale.gov/neighbors/civic-associations</a>); and,
    - 2. Provide notice via mailed letter to property owners whose real property is located within 300 feet of the proposed project, notifying of the date, time and place of applicant's project presentation meeting to take place prior to the PZB meeting.
  - b. The applicant shall conduct the public participation meeting(s) a minimum of 30 days prior to the PZB. This date and location of the meeting are at the discretion of the applicant. Once the meeting(s) is conducted, the applicant shall provide a written report letter to the Department of Sustainable Development, with copy to subject association(s), documenting the date(s), time(s), location(s), number of participants, presentation material and general summary of the discussion after a public participation meeting(s). The report letter shall summarize the substance of comments expressed during the process and shall be made a part of the administrative case file record. A minimum of ten (10) days prior to the PZB meeting, the applicant shall execute and submit an affidavit of proof of public notice to the Department.
- 2) The site is designated Commercial on the City's Future Land Use Map. The proposed use is permitted in this designation subject to the approval and allocation of flex units or allocation of nonresidential flex acreage. This is not a determination on consistency with Comprehensive Plan Goals, Objectives, and Policies.
- 3) A separate application and fee are required for a parking reduction. Should the application for a parking reduction be approved, a parking reduction order must be executed and recorded in the public records of Broward County at the applicant's expense, prior to Final DRC approval.
- 4) The proposed project requires review and approval by the Planning and Zoning Board. A separate application and fee are required for PZ Board submittal, and the applicant is responsible for all public notice requirements (Sec. 47-27). In addition, the development permit shall not take effect nor shall a building permit be issued until thirty (30) days after approval, and then only if no motion is adopted by the City Commission seeking to review the application.

This application is subject to Unified Land Development Regulations (ULDR) Section 47-27.4.A.2.c, Public Participation requirements. Prior to submittal of the application to the Planning and Zoning Board (PZB), a notice from the applicant via letter or e-mail shall be provided to official city-recognized civic organization(s) within 300 feet of the proposed project, notifying of the date, time and place of applicant's project presentation meeting to take place prior to the PZB meeting.

The applicant shall then conduct a public participation meeting(s) a minimum of 30 days prior to the PZB. This date and location of the meeting is at the discretion of the applicant. Once the meeting(s) is/are

conducted, the applicant shall provide a written report letter to the Department of Sustainable Development, with copy to subject association(s), documenting the date(s), time(s), location(s), number of participants, presentation material and general summary of the discussion after a public participation meeting(s). The report letter shall summarize the substance of comments expressed during the process and shall be made a part of the administrative case file record.

The applicant shall, 10 days prior to the PZB, execute and submit to the department an affidavit of proof of public notice according to this section. If the applicant fails to submit the affidavit, the public hearing will be postponed until the next available hearing date after the affidavit has been supplied.

- 5) Verify that copy of plat is the most current recorded plat, including notes and amendments, for the proposed site. Provide documentation from the Broward County Planning Council verifying that the site does not require platting or replatting. If replatting or platting is <u>not</u> required, contact the Development Review Services Section of the Planning and Environmental Regulation Division of Broward County at (954) 357-6637 to ensure that proposed project is consistent with the latest recorded plat restriction.
- 6) Please contact Jean-Paul Perez, Broward County Planning and Development Division at <a href="mailto:JPPerez@broward.org">JPPerez@broward.org</a> or 954-357-6637 to ensure the proposed plat note language meets their standards before moving forward. Please provide staff with written response from the County.
- 7) Provide legible photometric plan for the entire site. Extend values on photometric plans to all property lines. Show values pursuant to the Unified and Land Development Regulations ("ULDR"), Section 47-25.3.A.3.a and 47-20.14. Indicate lighting poles on site plan and landscape plan and provide detail with dimensions. Consider reducing the height of the light poles closest to the residential properties.
- 8) Provide the written statement from Broward County regarding any proposed improvements along the 19th Street right-of-way.
- 9) Clarify site plan and survey for portion being rezoned. Per notes on plans, portions of the adjacent property will need to be obtained by the applicant.
- 10) Provide the following on the site plan:
  - a) Consider reducing drive aisle width.
  - b) Consider shifting sidewalk to add open space.
  - c) Typical parking stall is 8 feet 8 inches by 18 feet.
- 11) Provide the following on the elevation plan:
  - a) Increase height of parapet height, include as part of the volume of the building.
  - b) Additional fenestration on the north and west elevations.
- 12) Provide roof plan with the following:
  - a) Spot elevations of the parapet wall and roof as well as mechanical equipment to verify adequate screening;
  - b) Height of mechanical equipment on roof plan.
  - c) Location of equipment on building elevations by outlining the equipment with dash lines; and
  - d) Screening panels should be a minimum of 6 inches higher to properly conceal the mechanical equipment.
- 13) Provide a detail sheet showing the wall details and the light pole details.

- 14) Coordinate the placement of the proposed utilities with engineering and landscape representatives. Indicate all utilities (both above and below ground) that would affect the proposed planting or landscape plan. Overhead lines (if any) should be placed underground. If the lines cannot be placed underground, provide documentation from Florida Power & Light Company indicating such.
- 15) Coordinate with the Floodplain Manager, Richard Benton, for floodplain inquires. (Email: RBenton@fortlauderdale.gov, Phone: 954-828-6133). Section 60.3(c)(3) of the NFIP regulations states that a community shall:
  - a) "Require that all new construction and substantial improvements of non-residential structures within Zones Al-A30, AE, and AH on the community's FIRM (i) have the lowest floor (including basement) elevated to or above the base flood level, or (ii) together with attendant utility and sanitary facilities, be designed so that below the base flood level the structure is watertight with walls substantially impermeable to the passage of water and with structural components having the capability of resisting hydrostatic and hydrodynamic loads and effects of buoyancy."
  - b) Below-grade parking garages are permitted beneath non-residential buildings in Zones A1-A30, AE, and AH provided the building (including the parking garage) is floodproofed to the base flood level in accordance with the design performance standards provided above in Section 60.3(c)(3)(ii). Only below-grade parking garages in non-residential buildings that are dry floodproofed are permitted under the NFIP.
  - c) Guidance on floodproofing is provided in the FEMA manual "Floodproofing Non-Residential Structures" and in Technical Bulletin 3, "Non-Residential Floodproofing Requirements and Certification."
- 16) Provide a construction staging plan which includes anticipated hours of operation on site, debris mitigation plan, and map indicating where crane operations and employee and/or equipment parking and storage will be placed. A revocable license application and a traffic circulation plan may be required if the sidewalk or right-of-way requires to be closed at any time, which should be filed under a separate application and coordinated through the City's Maintenance of Traffic (MOT) process.
- 17) The City's Vision is to support sustainable infrastructure. Consider employing green building practices throughout the project such as, but not limited to; charging stations, tank-less water heaters, rain collection systems, pervious pavement where appropriate, bio-swales, Florida Friendly™ plant materials, solar panels and green roofs.
- 18) If a temporary construction/sales trailer is needed for this project, provide the details and location of the trailer on a separate site plan, to avoid additional review in the future. Verify details and location with the Building Representative.

Provide a construction staging plan which includes anticipated hours of operation on site, debris mitigation plan, and map indicating where crane operations and employee and/or equipment parking and storage will be placed. A revocable license application and a traffic circulation plan may be required if the sidewalk or right-of-way requires to be closed at any time, which should be filed under a separate application and coordinated through the City's Maintenance of Traffic (MOT) process.
