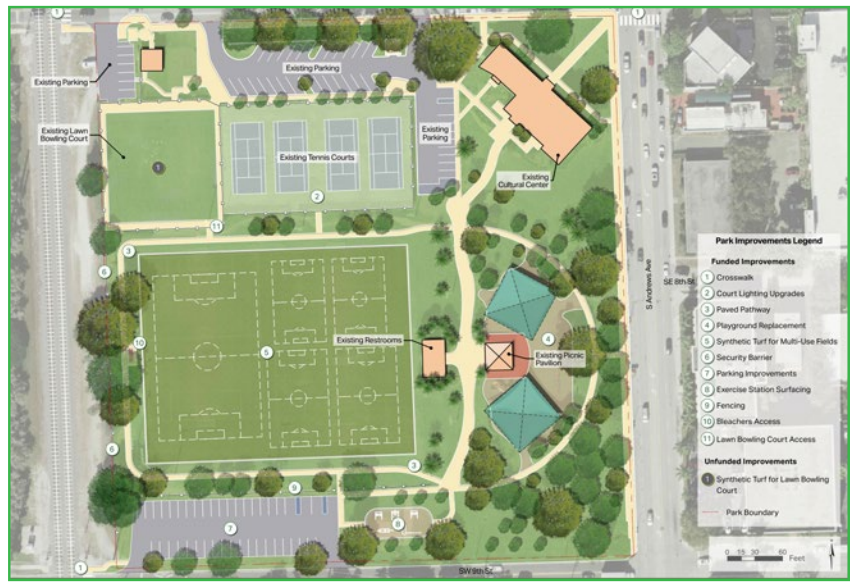

Proposed Parks Bond improvements at Florence C. Hardy Park

The City of Fort Lauderdale is committed to enhancing its identity through public art and community beautification. As part of this commitment, the City is proud to unveil its latest public art exhibit. The exhibit, a palm tree sculpture by world-class artist Romero Britto, was generously donated to the City by Yasmin Reger. This sculpture stands near downtown at Florence C. Hardy Park to enhance the aesthetics of the area and spur creativity amongst the community. This statue will also mark the continued expansion of the City’s recreational amenities with projects such as the LauderTrail on the horizon. This multi-use trail will pass by Florence C. Hardy Park along the Florida East Coast Railway to connect the City’s neighbors and visitors to various parks, transit, local businesses, and attractions.
