# **DISTRICT HAPPENINGS**

#### NW 21<sup>ST</sup> AVENUE STORMWATER IMPROVEMENT

The City of Fort Lauderdale is working with David Mancini & Sons, Inc. to make improvements to the stormwater system on NW 21st Avenue in the historic Dorsey Riverbend neighborhood to enhance its efficiency and reliability. This project includes:

- Installing new catch basins, new drainage pipes and repairing existing drainage pipes
- Reconstructing swale areas and Resurfacing pavement.

#### UPCOMING DURRS STORMWATER IMPROVEMENT

The City of Fort Lauderdale will be working on improvements to the stormwater system in the Durrs neighborhood to enhance its efficiency and reliability.

- Dr. James F. Sistrunk first black doctor, a portion of 6th street renamed after him and co-founder of the Provident Hospital
- Dr. Calvin H. Shirley- was a gynecologist/obstetrician by specialty, delivering over 6,000 babies and treated many other patients with different illnesses.
- Eula G. Johnson In 1961 while serving as the President of the NAACP she organized the "wade-ins" that integrated Fort Lauderdale Beach
- Dr. Von D. Mizell first black surgeon in Florida, cofounder of the Provident Hospital

## UNSUNG LOCAL HISTORY MAKERS



Mackinley Smith- was the first Black Sergeant and then the first Black Captain in the City of Fort Lauderdale. Mayor Dean Trantalis declared February 6, 2024, Mackinley Smith Day.



Chasity Roker - Seventeen-year-old Roker is a senior at Dillard High School. She is a proud member of the National Honor Society, the debate team, and the JROTC program and who hopes to join the United States Air Force to serve our country. Being a catalyst for change she, along with two other Dillard students, advocated for the Learning with Dignity Act. A bill aimed at alleviating period stigma and helping ensure students have access to products on campus for free.
