- Discussion on Police revenues received from Fines and Forfeitures The
  department advised that there may have been a decrease in the percentage
  shared with the local municipality. Personnel for the Motor unit has also
  decreased due to the number of vacancies in the department. It is a
  supplemental unit that will be staffed as other positions are filled.
- Discussion on Alarm Response Fees for both Police and Fire Rescue The
  departments are concerned about the community's reaction to the back billing;
  it is estimated that back billing could bring in \$3 million. The departments do
  not believe the revenues shared with the commission were realistic.
- Discussion on the Fire Inspection Fees The department advised that there
  are vacancies, which could impact revenue collection, but based on year-todate collection, the department did not raise an objection to using the budget's
  FY 2025 estimate.
